# GARDEN COMPETITION 2025

theme: Wildlife Friendly gardens

Woven is delighted to launch our inaugural gardening competition. We plan for this to be an annual competition to encourage our tenants to get in their gardens or greenspaces on scheme and take an active role in looking after the environment. Each year's competition will focus on a different theme and in 2025, we are looking for the best 'Wildlife Friendly Garden'

We are looking for ways tenants have encouraged wildlife in their green spaces and allowed it to thrive - think pollinator friendly planting, bug hotels, bird baths, bird/squirrel feeders, etc.)

There will be 3 categories tenants can enter to encourage tenants from all types of housing to enter:

This category is for tenants in schemes with shared greenspaces/communal gardens. Tenants are free to enter as a group. This is a great opportunity to get together to make a positive impact and have fun creating a vibrant greenspace for your scheme



This category is for tenants who are lucky enough to have their own private gardens! We are looking for innovation and ways in which wildlife have been considered when designing your garden. Why not get the whole family involved in a Summer project?



This category is for tenants who don't have their own private garden or don't wish to enter as a communal garden. This might include a balcony or a small paved outside area etc. Don't let your space limit you - you can still make a positive impact to the envionment!

## Lemon Drizzle Cake



#### Ingredients

- 225g unsalted butter, softened
- 225g caster sugar
- 4 free-range eggs
- 225g self-raising flour
- 1 unwaxed lemon, zest and juice
- 85g icing sugar

#### Method

- Preheat the oven to 180C/160C Fan
- Grease a 900g loaf tin with a little butter and line with baking paper.
- Tip the remaining butter and caster sugar into a food processor and blend for a few seconds. Add the eggs one at a time, blending after each
- Add the flour and lemon zest and blend until smooth.
- Pour the batter into the lined baking tin, flatten the top with the back of a spoon and bake for 50-55 minutes.
- Meanwhile, stir together the lemon juice and icing sugar.
- When the cake has cooled a little, poke holes in the top using a skewer and drizzle over the icing, set aside for a few minutes, and serve.

#### Ingredients

- 200g softened butter
- 200g caster sugar, plus 3 tbsp for topping
- 3 large free-range eggs

#### Rhubarb Cake

- 1 tsp vanilla or almond extract
- 200g ground almonds
- 200g self-raising flour
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 300g rhubarb, trimmed and cut into
- 2cm lengths

#### Method

- Preheat the oven to 180C/160C Fan. Grease a 23cm springform cake tin with butter and line base with baking paper.
- Put the butter, sugar, eggs, vanilla or almond extract, almonds, flour and baking powder in a food mixer. Beat until smooth and thick.
- Spoon the cake batter into the prepared tin. Top with the rhubarb, pressing it down gently. Sprinkle with 3 tablespoons of sugar.
- Bake for 1 hour 15 minutes.
- Cool in the tin for 20 minutes, then turn out onto a wire rack. Serve warm or cold.

## **SCHEME WALKABOUTS**

Woven staff are currently planning a series of Scheme Walkabouts at schemes across NI through Summer and Autumn.

During Scheme Walkabouts, members of Woven staff from Housing, Assets and Communities Teams are on site to walk around the development and note any issues.

Tenants are invited to join staff to ask questions or raise any concerns relating to the scheme. We encourage you to get involved.

SCHEME

Woven staff are currently planning a first phase of Walkabouts at the following schemes:

Old School Lane, Conars Court, Abercorn Court, Riverview, River Court - Derry/Londonderry; Anderson Crescent - Limavady; Upper Newtownards Rd - Dundonald; Platers - Coalisland McGurks, Parkgate - Belfast;

The first of these Walkabouts will take place in June and Woven will share dates and times on their social media platforms and notifications to the relevant schemes. Look out for messages.

# **DAMP & MOULD**

Woven will soon be reissuing a survey on Damp and Mould which was first conducted in Autumn 2024. It is being shared on the Woven website and promoted via text and on social media. Keep an eye out for notifications.

We encourage all tenants to respond to the survey. If you are not in receipt of text messages from Woven, you can check their website or ask to receive the survey by email.


#### **MOULD**

Too much condensation in your home can lead to problems such as mould growth. Mould Growth can affect your health and the health of your home.

#### **RISING DAMP**

Rising damp is caused by water in the soil moving up through a wall and only affects ground floor rooms or basements. It isn't very common and is usually prevented by a barrier called a damp-proof course. Rising damp can occur if the damp-proof course in your home is either missing or damaged.

Signs of rising damp include damaged skirting boards and floorboards, crumbling or salt stained plaster, and peeling paint or wallpaper. It often has the appearance of a tide mark running along the bottom of a wall.



# MENU OF INVOLVEMENT DRAFT

Members of Woven Residents' Forum have been working with Supporting Communities to develop a new Menu of Tenant Involvement for Woven.

This is an ongoing project involving Residents' Forum, members of Woven staff and Supporting Communities.

After considering structures belonging to other social landlords, the tenant group designed and agreed on a visual house infographic to demonstrate how tenants can get involved with the range of options and how to better convey the two-way communication across the organisation.

The Infographic is still being developed by tenants in consultation with Woven staff and, when complete, will be uploaded to the Woven website and will replace existing Menu of Involvement Options in Woven publications.

The tenant led Editorial Panel are sharing a sneak preview of the draft infographic here to show the work in progress. The live version when complete, will link the menu items, to a description of each e.g. click on the item and read more.

The new Menu will be signposted in Woven social media and promoted to tenants when complete.
